2009. The new year is often a time for reflection. We reflect on our best values. We evaluate what we believe. And each year, we try to reset the compass of our lives so that we live a little more closely to our deepest beliefs. The new year calls to us like an unwritten script, inviting us to fill the blank pages with the best we have to offer to each other and to God.

What are the beliefs that shape our lives? And how can we live them better day by day? No one can answer that question for anyone else. As I reflect on the question of belief for myself, I think that perhaps my deepest belief has to do with what I would call "loving kindness".

In the Hebrew Scriptures, the word that is often translated "lovingkindness" is *hesed*, and describes a kind of love that only God can exhibit. We humans can receive God's *hesed*, but we do not have the capacity to initiate it. It is one of the things that makes God different from us. But, having received God's *hesed*, we can share it.

Lovingkindness has nothing to do with a romantic kind of love, and everything to do with how we act - toward ourselves, toward people we like, toward people we dislike and toward God.

In the New Testament, the Apostle Paul wrote about a similar kind of love - *agape* - when he wrote *Faith, hope and love abide, these three. And the greatest of these is love.* For Jesus, love of God, neighbor and self sums up all the commandments.

And so, if I were to say what my deepest belief is, I would say that it is love. God's love for us, our love for one another, for ourselves, and for the earth - expressed in acts of lovingkindness.

Every day I fall short of fully living that deep belief. I mess up. I get too busy. I forget. But here are some of the ways that I have tried to live it out in the past and will try again in the coming year.

Prayer. Prayer connects me to God's lovingkindness, filling my soul with new strength and wisdom. Journalling. Journalling helps me to connect to my own wisdom, and helps me to see ways that I could live my beliefs better. Exercise. Exercise helps me to stay centered and present to each new day. Work. Work that connects me to the real needs of the human spirit and body provides many, many opportunities to share loving kindness in the world. From calling in the hospital, to sitting in a courtroom with a grieving family, to standing at a graveside speaking those final words, to sharing the joy of a new baby's birth, to crafting the words of a sermon, to speaking out for justice in a City Council meeting. The work of ministry is filled with opportunities for loving kindness. Rest. Rest that includes time to read and quilt and knit and canoe and sail and hike restores balance and wholeness. It fills my cup so that I have something to share again. Forgiveness. Forgiveness means that I can keep on keeping on. Both in the offering and receiving - forgiveness makes new life possible day by day. I'm sure there's more that needs to be on my list, but somehow that seems like enough!

I pray that in the coming few weeks you might reflect a bit on your deepest beliefs. What are they? Why? Who taught you? Spend a little time remembering and then reflect a bit on how your life can better reflect what you most deeply believe. It's an exercise that is worth the work!

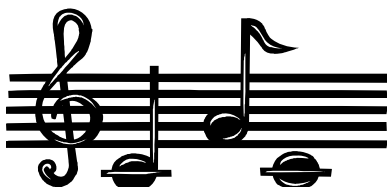

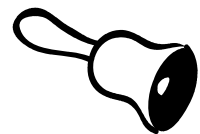

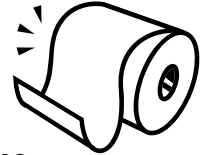
