From Our Pastors Desk...

Thanksgiving is a wonderful time of year. For many it is a national day of overeating and football. For even more it is the pre-season warm-up game for the Christmas rush. For us in the United Church of Christ, it is an opportunity to reflect on our religious heritage. We, who are descended from those early Pilgrims, still hold fast to the principles of religious freedom, and we are reminded of the sacrifices which made that possible in this country. It is a time when we can pause and remember who we are and whose we are.

At its best, Thanksgiving is a season of gratitude - a time to practice the spiritual discipline of a grateful heart. Gratitude is a virtue we don't talk a lot about anymore - instead we talk about what we deserve. We have lost something important, it seems to me.

Gratitude opens our hearts and minds to the presence of God in our midst. Gratitude helps us to name how God is at work in our world. Gratitude reminds us that none of us live unto ourselves, but instead we are linked to a whole network of care and concern - through good times and bad times.

When we practice gratitude, our ability to be grateful increases. When we let gratitude slip through our fingers, we lose the ability to see the gifts that are right in our back yard.

I am grateful for many things these days. I am grateful for the freedom to vote this month. I am grateful for a family that laughs and loves more than it doesn't. I am grateful for a church that stands for justice and invites deep reflection on the issues of the day. I am grateful for health - and health insurance. I am grateful for the beauty of the leaves turning and for the changing of the seasons that brings a new rhythm to my days. I am grateful for our Confirmation youth who remind me to be playful at the end of the day. I don't deserve any of these things. They are gifts for me to both treasure and nurture.

Gratitude is a discipline. It is a practice of our faith. The more we practice it, the stronger it gets - and the better we get at it. I invite you to set this month aside as a time to consider the things for which you are grateful. The list might surprise you! But don't stop there. Find new ways to live your gratitude - thanksgiving for God's love in your life, for both your family's nurture and its challenges, for the work that sustains food and shelter in your life, for your faith that carries you and helps you to carry others, for the church that both blesses and challenges you.....

As you find new ways to express grateful thanksgiving day by day, you may be surprised at how it may multiply in the hearts and minds of those around you!

1,000 Peace Cranes

One of the most famous origami forms, the crane, has become recognized globally as a symbol of peace for the past half-century. Inspired by a young survivor of Hiroshima who believed in the Japanese legend that anyone who folds one thousand paper cranes will have their heart's desire come true, her one wish was to bring peace and healing to victims of war around the world. The children, youth, mentors and teachers of Edwards have begun folding 1,000 paper cranes. Our hope is to have 1,000 folded by Christmas and fill our sanctuary with prayers for peace in the New Year. Every Sunday, those who know how to fold will be sitting at tables in Baxter Hall hoping to teach someone else how to fold a crane for peace. Will you let someone teach you?

InterFaith Thanksgiving

This year will mark the 63rd year that Edwards has gathered with the Unitarian Church and Temple Emanuel to celebrate Thanksgiving. This year we will gather on the evening of November 19 (the Sunday night before the big day), and we will be at the Temple. This year we will celebrate with a Thanksgiving seder meal. The evening will include a turkey dinner, as well as the ritual seder question and answer time. This is a wonderful opportunity to share in the ancient Jewish seder tradition, as well as to remember our own heritage as people of faith.

Because this service takes place around tables, the Temple is asking for reservations. In addition, we would gratefully accept your donation of \$7 per person (children under 10 years old come free) toward the cost of the meal. Stewardship 2007

November 12th is Stewardship Sunday - the day we gather up our pledges of financial support for 2007 so that the Trustees can make a budget for the coming year. You will receive a pledge card in the mail within the next week, and we ask that you prayerfully consider how much you can give.

Monetary giving is one of the foundations upon which our faith is built. Jesus talked more about money than he did about love (that's really true!), and he understood that our relationship with money has the potential to both harm us and benefit us. According to Jesus, when we hoard financial resources we risk the health of our souls. On the other hand, when we share financial resources draws the circle of God's kingdom on earth draws near.

How much is enough? No one can tell you how much to give - only you know your budget and your family's needs. Giving to the church ought to be enough so that we notice the gift, but not so much that we go without important things in order to meet our pledge. Scripture suggests a percentage of our income - 5%? 10%?

Know that your gifts make a difference here at Edwards. Please consider a generous gift toward the 2007 church year! And come on November 12th to celebrate the generous witness of our church - both outside and inside the church walls.

CareNet Corner

The news media recently reported that the US population has now reached the 300 million mark. So many people!! And yet a news article of two months ago pointed out how lonely and isolated we tend to be: 25% of households consist of just one person; the average American reports only having two close friends in whom they could confide on important matters; (down from an average of 3 in 1985); the number of people who say they have no such confidant increased from 10% to 25%; and an additional 19% said they have only one confidant.

There are more people but more loneliness! Social isolation or disconnectedness can be a serious, even life-threatening condition, heightening the risks of heart disease and depression. The feeling of loneliness and isolation can strike at almost any age, in any demographic sector - parents struggling to adjust to empty-nest status, divorcees unable to rebuild a social life, even seemingly self-confident college students. How can you combat this problem you may ask? You can become a CareNet volunteer here at Edwards! Volunteering requires just a few minutes a month on the telephone to help keep everyone feel connected within the caring community that is Edwards.
